



Robert Chilcott (born 9th April 1955) is a British choral composer, conductor and singer, based in Oxfordshire. He was born in Plymouth but moved with his family to Watford while still young where he joined the church choir. The assistant organist was Andrew Davis. He then went on to sing in the choir of King's College, both as a boy and a student.

He was a member of the King's Singers from 1985 to 1997 and the conductor of the chorus at the Royal College of Music for seven years.

As a composer, he has a large catalogue of music published by OUP that reflects his broad view of musical styles and genres. His many works are widely recorded around the world.

He has directed choirs in more than 30 countries and conducts many thousands of amateur singers in a continuing series of Singing Days.

Last year he became President of Southwell Choral Society.
